DECISION

CASE OF V. THE CZECH REPUBLIC

(Application no. 57346/22) introduced on 9 December 2022

The European Court of Human Rights, sitting on 9 February 2023 in a single-judge formation pursuant to Articles 24 § 2 and 27 of the Convention, has examined the application as submitted.

The application refers to Article 6 § 1 of the Convention, Article 8 § 1 of the Convention and Article 1 of Protocol No. 1.

As concerns the complaints raised under Article 6 § 1 of the Convention and Article 8 § 1 of the Convention, the Court finds in the light of all the material in its possession that the matters complained of do not disclose any appearance of a violation of the rights and freedoms set out in the Convention or the Protocols thereto. Accordingly, these complaints are manifestly ill-founded within the meaning of Article 35 § 3 (a).

As concerns the complaints raised under Article 1 of Protocol No. 1, the Court finds that domestic remedies have not been exhausted as required by Article 35 § 1 of the Convention, since the applicant failed to raise before competent domestic authorities, either in form or in substance and in accordance with the applicable procedural requirements, the complaints that were made to the Court.

The Court declares the application inadmissible.
